English Teacher: Is the internet very important to you?

Darby Laai: For sure yeah.

English Teacher: Why?

Darby Laai: A couple of reasons. First, I use the internet to communicate with people that I work with, so I need things like email and instant messaging to get my job done. And uhh...in addition to that there are many things I can learn from all kinds of websites on the internet.

English Teacher: When did you first learn to use the internet?

Darby Laai: After university.

English Teacher: Why?

Darby Laai: Because we didn't have widespread access to the internet in university. As a result, I did things the old school way. I thought about them and researched books and journals in print. And I had actual real discussions with my friends. Most young people these days just give up if they can't find it on the internet. Actually, they do find stuff on the internet, but they don't know how to separate the sheep from the goats...you know what I mean?

English Teacher: Hang on...what do you mean? I consider myself a young person.

English Teacher: Right...but in this situation, I don't think that one sounds natural. But you did use a very nice combination in your first reason when you started with "A couple of reasons". Just be patient and you will begin to hear when alternatives to "because" sound natural or not.


Darby Laai: Ok I see..


Preparation Feedback Comment

 Avoid telling your teacher that you "forgot" to use something and be patient with the process. You will eventually get it and receive green flag feedback to your focused responses.

Assessment Feedback Comment

 You used an alternative expression to "because" that was natural and meaningful. This is important for grammar and vocabulary.

 You used alternative expressions while giving your reason, but you need to pick the right expression to match your meaning during your preparation for the task.

 If you only use simple sentence beginnings when giving reasons, you will lose the opportunity to show a range of vocabulary to the interviewer. Perhaps try this task again?
